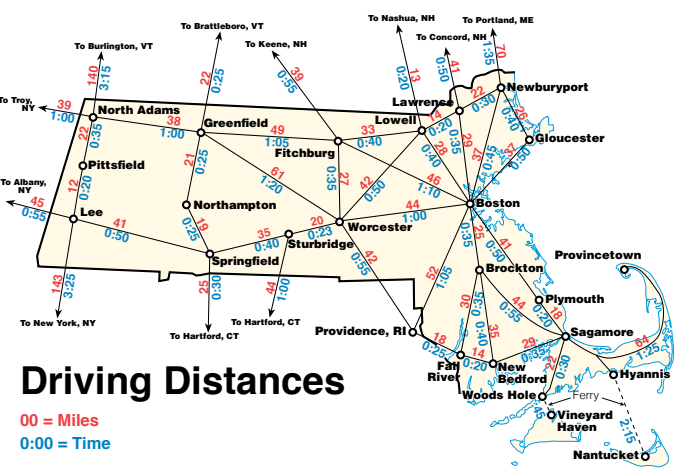


MASSACHUSETTS STATE HIGHWAY MAP

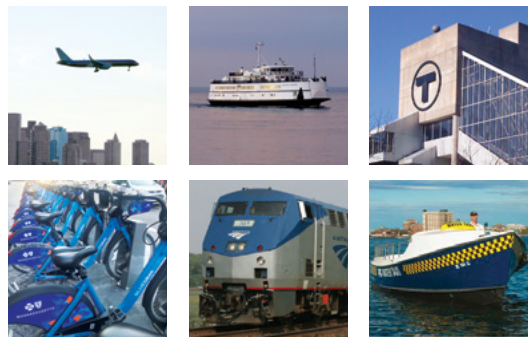
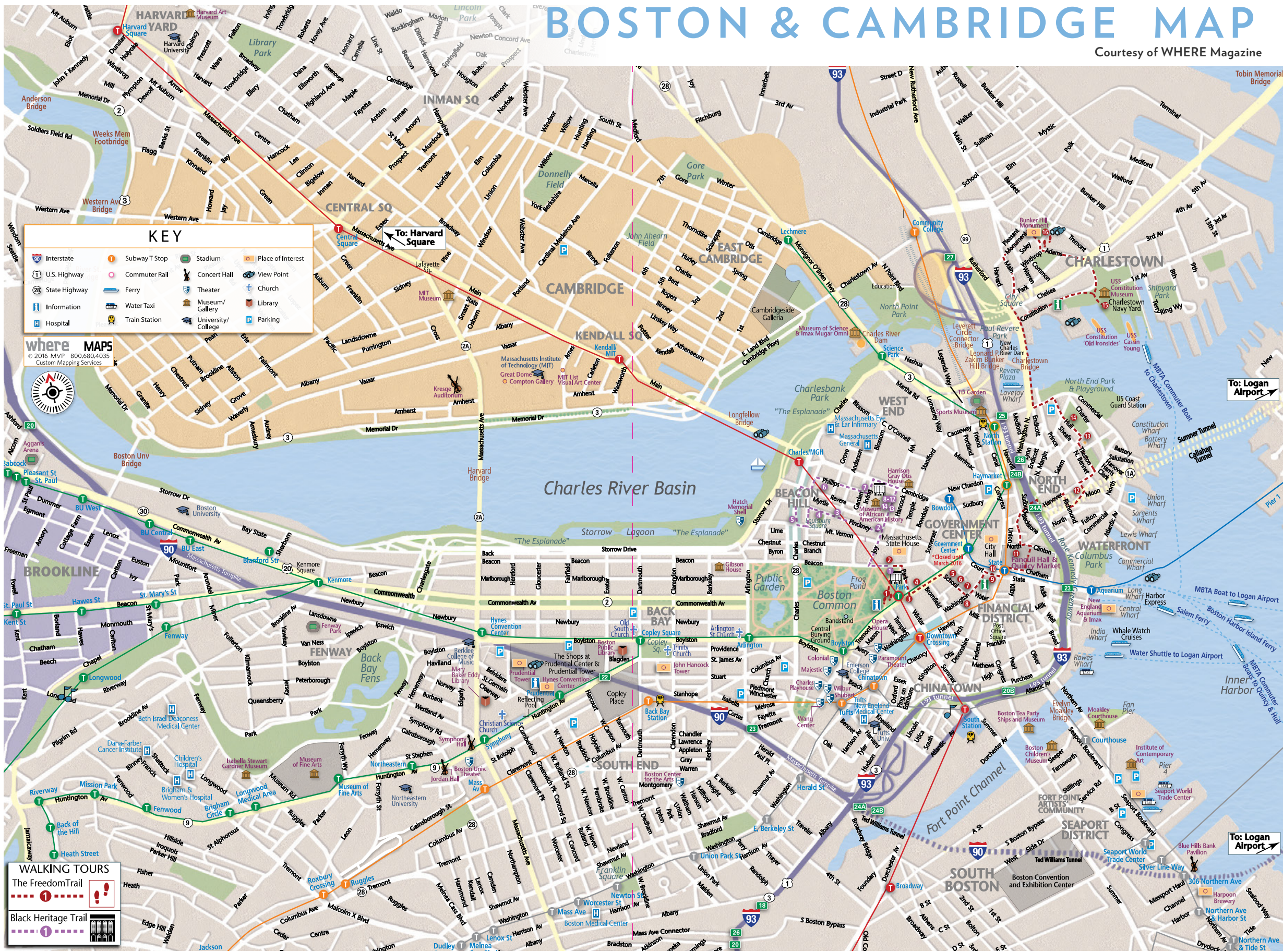

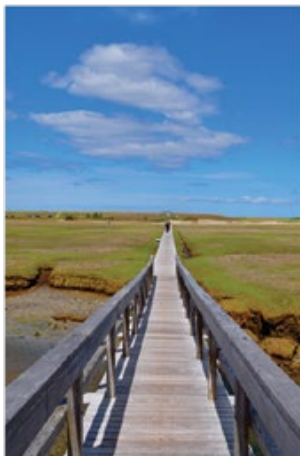
